

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

Spiritual Warfare

ll men ought to love peace. War is an immense evil, though it is a necessary evil sometimes. Battles are bloody and distressing events, though sometimes nations cannot maintain their rights without them. But all men ought to love peace. All ought to pray for a quiet life. All this is very true, and yet there is one war which it is a positive duty to carry on; there is one battle which we ought to be always fighting. The battle I speak of is the battle against the world, the flesh, and the devil. With these enemies we never ought to be at peace; from this warfare no man ought ever to seek to be discharged, while he is alive. ... Every professing Christian is the soldier of Christ. He is bound by his baptism to fight Christ's battle against sin, the world, and the devil. The man that does not do this, breaks his vow ... The man that does not do this, is practically renouncing his Christianity. The very fact that he belongs to a Church, attends a Christian place of worship, and calls himself a Christian, is a public declaration that he desires to be reckoned a soldier of Jesus Christ.¹

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God, The Almighty.

1 In His Word, God is called a <u>Warrior</u>

- Exodus 15:3-7 (After the destruction of Pharaoh's army) "The Lord is a WARRIOR ... Thy right hand, O Lord, shatters the enemy. And in the greatness of Thine excellence Thou dost overthrow those who rise up against Thee; Thou dost send forth Thy burning anger, and it consumes them as chaff."
- <u>Isaiah 42:13</u> "The Lord will go forth like a WARRIOR, He will arouse His zeal like a MAN OF WAR."
- Zephaniah 3:17 "The Lord your God is in your midst, a VICTORIOUS WARRIOR."

2 He is also called a <u>Dread Champion</u>

- <u>Jeremiah 20:11</u> "But the Lord is with me like a DREAD CHAMPION; therefore my persecutors will stumble and not prevail."
- Nahum 1:2 "A jealous and avenging God is the Lord; The Lord is avenging and wrathful. The Lord takes vengeance on His adversaries, and He reserves wrath for His enemies."

3 God the Son is the <u>Commander</u> of a vast angelic army.

• <u>Joshua 5:13-15</u> - (*Before the destruction of Jericho*) "Now it came about when Joshua was by Jericho, that he lifted up his eyes and looked, and behold, a Man was standing opposite him with His SWORD DRAWN in His hand, and Joshua went to Him and said to Him, 'Are you for us or for our adversaries?' And He said, 'No, rather I indeed come now as CAPTAIN OF THE HOST OF THE LORD.' And Joshua fell on his face to the earth, and bowed down"

4 God is Omnipotent - all powerful.

- Genesis 17:1 "I am God Almighty" (58x)
- Romans 8:31 "If God is for us, who can stand against us?"
- 1 John 4:4 "greater is He who is in you than he who is in the world."

Therefore He is <u>mighty in battle</u>

- Psalm 24:8 "Who is the King of glory? The Lord strong and mighty, the Lord MIGHTY IN BATTLE."
- 1 Samuel 17: 45-47 (Before the destruction of the Philistine's army) "Then David said to [Goliath], 'You come to me with a sword, a spear, and a javelin, but I come to you in the name of the Lord of hosts, the God of the armies of Israel, whom you have taunted. This day the Lord will deliver you up into my hands ... that all this assembly may know that the Lord does not deliver by sword or by spear; for the BATTLE is the Lord's"
- <u>2 Chron. 20:15</u> (Before the destruction of the armies of Moab and Ammon) "Thus says the Lord to you, 'Do not fear or be dismayed because of this great multitude, for the BATTLE is not yours but God's."
- Proverbs 21:31 "The horse is prepared for the day of BATTLE, but victory belongs to the Lord."

5 God is Omniscient - all knowing

• Psalm 147:5 - "Great is our Lord ... His understanding is infinite."

Therefore He knows the enemy's plans.


• 2 Kings 6:8-12 - "Now the king of Aram was warring against Israel; and he counseled with his servants saying, 'In such and such a place shall be my camp.' The man of God [Elisha] sent word to the king of Israel saying, 'Beware that you do not pass this place, for the Arameans are coming down there.' The king of Israel sent to the place about which the man of God had told him; thus he warned him, so that he guarded himself there, more than once or twice. Now the heart of the king of Aram was enraged over this thing; and he called his servants and said to them, 'Will you tell me which of us is for the king of Israel?' One of his servants said, 'No, my lord, O king; but Elisha, the prophet who is in Israel, tells the king of Israel the words that you speak in your bedroom.'"

6 God is Omnipresent - everywhere

- Psalm 46:1 "God is a very present help in times of trouble"
- Psalm 73:28 "But as for me, the nearness of God is my good"

Power Belongs to God

"Power belongs to God,' (Psa. 62:11) and to Him alone. Not a creature in the entire universe has an atom of power save what God delegates. But God's power is not acquired ... It belongs to Him inherently.⁴



REVELATION 19:11-16

- 11 And I saw heaven opened; and behold, a white horse, and He who sat upon it is called Faithful and True; and in righteousness He judges and wages war.
- 12 And His eyes are a flame of fire, and upon His head are many diadems; and He has a name written upon Him which no one knows except Himself.
- 13 And He is clothed with a robe dipped in blood; and His name is called The Word of God.
- 14 And the armies which are in heaven, clothed in fine linen, white and clean, were following Him on white horses.



"I looked, and I heard the voice of many angels around the throne ... and the number of them was myriads of myriads, and thousands of thousands"

Revelation 5:11

1 Angels are <u>created beings</u>, made by Christ during the six days of creation.

- Exodus 20:11 "For in six days the Lord made the heavens and the earth, the sea and all that is in them..." (cf. Gen. 2:1)
- Nehemiah 9:6 "Thou alone art the Lord. Thou hast made the heavens, the heaven of heavens with all their host"
- <u>Job 38:4,7</u> "when I laid the foundation of the earth ... the morning stars sang together, and all the sons of God shouted for joy?" ← Created 1st day?
- <u>Psalm 148:2.5</u> "Praise Him, all His angels ... For He commanded and they were created."
- <u>Colossians 1:16</u>—"For by Him all things were created, both in the heavens and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities..."



- Matt. 26:52-53 "Then Jesus said to [Peter] ... 'do you think that I cannot appeal to My Father, and He will at once put at My disposal more than twelve legions of angels?"
- <u>Psalm 103:20</u> "Bless the Lord, you His angels, mighty in strength, who perform His word, obeying the voice of His word!"

5 They <u>protect believers</u>. (cf. Gen. 19; Acts 12:1-11)

- 2 Kings 6:15-17 "Now when the attendant of the man of God had risen early and gone out, behold, an army with horses and chariots was circling the city. And his servant said to him, 'Alas, my master! What shall we do?' So he answered, 'Do not fear, for those who are with us are more than those who are with them.' Then Elisha prayed and said, 'O Lord, I pray, open his eyes that he may see.' And the Lord opened the servant's eyes and he saw; and behold, the mountain was full of horses and chariots of fire all around Elisha." cf. Psalm 34:7
- Psalm 34:7 "The angel of the Lord encamps around those who fear Him, and rescues them."
- Psalm 91:11 "For He will give His angels charge over you, to guard you in all your ways."
- Matthew 18:10 "See that you do not despise one of these little ones, for I say to you, that their angels in heaven continually behold the face of My Father who is in heaven."
- <u>Hebrews 1:14</u> "Are they not all ministering spirits, sent out to render service for the sake of those who will inherit salvation?"

6 They <u>fight battles</u> in the spiritual realm.

- <u>Daniel 10:11-13</u> Michael fought the [spiritual] prince (demon) of Persia.
- Revelation 12:7-9 "there was war in heaven, Michael and his angels waging war with the dragon. And the dragon and his angels waged war ... And the great dragon was thrown down, the serpent of old who is called the devil and Satan ... and his angels were thrown down with him."
- Revelation 20:1-2 "Then I saw an angel coming down from heaven, holding the key of the abyss and a great chain in his hand. 2 And he laid hold of the dragon, the serpent of old, who is the devil and Satan, and bound him for a thousand years"



Revelation 17

- 3 And he carried me away in the Spirit into a wilderness; and I saw a woman sitting on a scarlet beast, full of blasphemous names, having seven heads and ten horns.
- 4 And the woman was clothed in purple and scarlet, and adorned with gold and precious stones and pearls, having in her hand a gold cup full of abominations and of the unclean things of her immorality,
- 5 and upon her forehead a name was written, a mystery, "Babylon the Great, the Mother of Harlots, and of the abominations of the earth."

Interpretation

Babylon = The world system of immoral government, commerce, philosophy & man-made religion.

3 We Overcome The World By:

A. Faith in Jesus Christ

- 1 John 5:4-5 "For whatever is born of God overcomes the world; and this is the victory that has overcome the world -- our faith. And who is the one who overcomes the world, but he who believes that Jesus is the Son of God?"
- 1 John 4:4 "You are from God, little children, and have overcome them; because greater is He who is in you than he who is in the world."
- <u>Hebrews 2:18</u> "For since Christ Himself was tempted in that which He has suffered, He is able to come to the aid of those who are tempted."

B. Prayer for Help.

• Matthew 26:41 - "Keep watching and praying that you may not enter into temptation; the spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak."

C. <u>Separating Ourselves</u>.

- 2 Corinthians 6:14-17 "Do not be bound together with unbelievers; for what partnership have righteousness and lawlessness, or what fellowship has light with darkness? Or what harmony has Christ with Belial, or what has a believer in common with an unbeliever? Or what agreement has the temple of God with idols? For we are the temple of the living God; just as God said, 'I will dwell in them and walk among them; and I will be their God, and they shall be My people. Therefore, come out from their midst and be separate,' says the Lord. 'And do not touch what is unclean; and I will welcome you." cf. Rev. 18:4
- 1Corinthians 15:33 "Do not be deceived, bad company corrupts good morals."

D. Renewing Our Minds . . .

• Romans 12:2 - "And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind..."

E. Spiritual Accountability

- Proverbs 27:17 "Iron sharpens iron, so one man sharpens another."
- <u>Galatians 6:1-2</u> "Brethren, even if a man is caught in any trespass, you who are spiritual, restore such a one in a spirit of gentleness; each one looking to yourself, lest you too be tempted. Bear one another's burdens, and thus fulfill the law of Christ."

Through meditation:


Guarding Against Temptation

"Temptations that have been anticipated, guarded against, and prayed about have little power to harm us. Jesus tells us to 'keep watching and praying, that you may not come into temptation' (Mark 14:38). Victory over temptation comes from being constantly prepared for it, which, in turn, comes from constantly relying on the Lord." ¹³

1 War With the Flesh.

- <u>James 1:14-15</u> "But each one is tempted when he is carried away and enticed by his own lust. Then when lust has conceived, it gives birth to sin; and when sin is accomplished, it brings forth death."
- Galatians 5:17 "For the flesh sets its desire against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh; for these are in opposition to one another, so that you may not do the things that you please."
- Romans 7:18-19 "For I know that nothing good dwells in me, that is, in my flesh; for the willing is present in me, but the doing of the good is not. For the good that I want, I do not do, but I practice the very evil that I do not want."
- 1 Peter 2:11 "Beloved, I urge you as aliens and strangers to abstain from fleshly lusts which wage war against the soul."
- Genesis 4:7 "If you do well, will not your countenance be lifted up? And if you do not do well, sin is crouching at the door; and its desire is for you, but you must master it."

2 What Are You Feeding?

• <u>Galatians 6:8</u> - "For the one who sows to his own flesh will from the flesh reap corruption, but the one who sows to the Spirit will from the Spirit reap eternal life."



3 We Overcome The Flesh By:

A. Walking in the Spirit

- Romans 8:13 "for if you are living according to the flesh, you must die; but if by the Spirit you are putting to death the deeds of the body, you will live."
- Galatians 5:16 "But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not carry out the desire of the flesh."
- Galatians 5:25 "If we live by the Spirit (regeneration), let us also walk by the Spirit (sanctification)."

B. Fearing God

• <u>2 Corinthians 7:1</u> - "Therefore, having these promises, beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from all defilement of flesh and spirit, perfecting holiness in the fear of God."

C. Crucifying the flesh

- Galatians 5:24 "Now those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires." (cf. Gal. 2:20)
- Galatians 2:20 "I have been crucified with Christ; and it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me, and delivered Himself up for me."
- Romans 8:13 "for if you are living according to the flesh, you must die; but if by the Spirit you are putting to death the deeds of the body, you will live."
- Romans 6:6 "knowing this, that our old self was crucified with Him, that our body of sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves to sin"
- Romans 6:11 "Even so consider yourselves to be dead to sin, but alive to God in Christ Jesus."
- Colossians 3:5 "Put to death, therefore, whatever belongs to your earthly nature: sexual immorality, impurity, lust, evil desires and greed, which is idolatry." (NIV)
- 1 Corinthians 15:31 "I die daily"

The Holy Spirit

"Walking by the Spirit' and 'being led by the Spirit' refer to the same thing. 'Being led by the Spirit' stresses the Spirit's initiative and enablement. 'Walking by the Spirit' stresses our resulting behavior. The Spirit leads us by creating desires to obey God, and we walk by fulfilling those desires in action." ¹⁷



Why Can't the Devil be Redeemed?

C. H. Spurgeon (1834-1892)



"These angels, that kept not their first estate, but sinned against God, dwelt with their brethren in the courts of the Most High; they seemed to be, as it were, walled round with fire to keep out all evil from them. Their communications were only with perfect spirits like themselves; but yet, as they were undergoing a probation, they were made capable of choosing evil if they willed so to do, or of cleaving to good if their hearts were steadfast with their God. There were none about them to tempt them to evil; they were, on the contrary, surrounded with every good and holy influence: they saw God, and abode in his courts, they conversed with seraphim and cherubim. Their daily engagements were all of a holy order; worship and service were their duty and delight. Their company was select; there were no lapsed classes among them to render the moral atmosphere impure. They were not only in a paradise, but in the central abode of God himself. Yet evil entered into the breasts of angels—even envy, ambition, pride, rebellion; and they fell, fell never to rise again" 28

Can A Christian Be Demon-Possessed?

R. C. Sproul (1939-Present)



"In the Bible, we see [demons] possessing people and oppressing people, causing bodily harm, property damage, and all kinds of things. The Christian is always faced with this question: Can I be demon-possessed? I don't believe so. I believe that people can be demon-possessed, but I don't think that this is possible for a Christian, because God the Holy Spirit resides in the regenerate person, and the Scriptures tell us, "Where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty" (2 Cor. 3:17). So, no demon can hold us hostage to the power of Satan. Demons can oppress us, they can harass us, they can tempt us, attack us and so on, but thanks be to God, He who is in us is greater than he who is in the world (1 John 4:4). ²⁹

Setting.


The epistle to the Ephesians was written by the Apostle Paul from Prison in Rome.

2 Symbology.

• In Ephesians 6, Paul is describing the Christian's <u>Spiritual</u> armor and weapons, by comparing them to the physical pieces of armor of the Roman Soldiers who were guarding him. Theses soldiers were the emperor's palace bodyguards, called the praetorian guard (Phil. 1:12-13).

Ephesians 6:10-18

"Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of His might. 11 Put on the full armor of God, so that you will be able to stand firm against the schemes of the devil. 12 For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the powers, against the world forces of this darkness, against the spiritual forces of wickedness in the heavenly places. 13 Therefore, take up the full armor of God, so that you will be able to resist in the evil day, and having done everything, to stand firm. 14 Stand firm therefore, 1 having girded your loins with truth, and 2 having put on the breastplate of righteousness, 15 and 3 having shod your feet with the preparation of the Gospel of peace; 16 in addition to all, 4 taking up the shield of faith with which you will be able to extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one. 17 And 5 take the helmut of salvation, and 6 the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God. 18 7 With all prayer and petition pray at all times"

Prepare your mind for battle, trials, etc. (ahead of time), by integrating the objective principles of God's Word into your life.



Observation.

- Paul likens righteousness to a Roman soldier's "breastplate," Greek: thorax
- It was the largest piece of armor, and therefore most fully covered the soldier. It deflected or absorbed the blows of the enemy, protected the vital organs, and covered the heart.

2 Correlation.

- Elsewhere in Scripture righteousness is likened to clothing.
- <u>Job 29:14-14</u> "I put on righteousness, and it clothed me"
- Isaiah 61:10 "I will rejoice greatly in the Lord, My soul will exult in my God; for He has clothed me with garments of salvation, He has wrapped me with a robe of righteousness"

3 Interpretation.

• Meaning of Paul's phrase "put on the breastplate of righteousness" -

Let Christ's imputed righteousness guard your heart against selfrighteousness, and fight hard to make your practice match your position.

4 Application.

• Ephesians 4:1 - "Therefore I, the prisoner of the Lord, implore you to walk in [practice] a manner worthy of the calling [position] with which you have been called."



2 Interpretation.

• "Taking up the helmet of salvation" means guarding our minds with the hope of our salvation (1 Thess. 5:8) - a hope which is sure and will not disappoint (Rom. 5:1, 5). Therefore, it is ultimately a belief in our <u>eternal security</u> in Christ Jesus.

Triune Work of Eternal Security

1. The Father's <u>eternal purpose</u>.

(Job 42:2; Jer. 29:11; Rom. 11:29)

• Ephesians 1:4-5 – "He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world ... In love He predestined us to adoption as sons through Jesus Christ to Himself, according to the kind intention of His will"

2. The Father's <u>immutable love</u>.

(Jer. 31:3: Micah 7:18: Psa. 103:17: Eph. 2:4-6)

• Romans 8:38-39 – "For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other created thing, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord."

3. The Father's <u>protective power</u>. (Jn. 10:27-29; 2 Tim. 1:12; Rom. 8:31; Jude 1:24-25)

• <u>1 Peter 1:5</u> – You "are protected by the power of God through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time."

4. The Father <u>completes</u> what He starts.

(Phil. 1:6; 1 Cor. 1:8)

• Romans 8:30 – "whom He predestined, these He also called; and whom He called, these He also justified; and whom He justified, these He also glorified."

5. Christ's perfect sacrifice.

(John 19:30; Heb. 10:10-14)

• Hebrews 10:12, 14 - "but He [Christ], having offered one sacrifice for sins for all time, sat down at the right hand of God, ... For by one offering He has perfected for all time those who are sanctified."

6. Christ's <u>intercession</u>

(Rom. 8:34; John 11:42, 17:9,15; 1 John 2:1; Luke 22:31-32)

• Hebrews 7:25 – "Hence, also, He is able to save forever those who draw near to God through Him, since He always lives to make intercession for them."

7. Christ Will /ose not one of those given to Him. (John 10:27-29, 17:2)

• John 6:37-39 – "All that the Father gives Me shall come to Me ... all that He has given Me I lose nothing, but raise it up on the last day."

8. The Spirit Permanently <u>indwells</u> & <u>seals</u> us. (1 Cor. 3:16, 6:19; Rom. 8:9; Eph. 4:30)

• Ephesians 1:13 – "you were sealed in Him with the Holy Spirit of promise who is given as a pledge of our inheritance, with a view to the redemption of God's own possession, to the praise of His glory."





ike the Spartans, every Christian is born a warrior. It is his destiny to be assaulted, his duty to attack. Part of his life will be occupied with defensive warfare. He will have to defend the Faith once delivered to the saints. He will have to resist the devil. He will have to Stand against all the devil's wiles, and having done all, still to stand. He will, however, be an ineffective Christian, if he acts only on the defensive. He must be one who goes against his foes, as well as [one who] stands still to receive their advance. He must be able to say with David, "I come to thee in the Name of The Lord of Hosts, The God of the armies of Israel, whom thou hast defied" (1 Sam. 17:45). He must wrestle not with flesh and blood, but against principalities and powers. He must have weapons for his warfare - not carnal - but "mighty through God to the pulling down of strongholds" (2 Cor. 10:4). He must not be content to live in the stronghold, though he is well guarded, and munitions of stupendous strength are at his disposal; but he must go forth to attack the castles of the enemy, pull them down." 37



God's Sovereignty

Under the most adverse circumstances, in the most severe troubles, they believe that Sovereignty hath ordained their afflictions, that Sovereignty overrules them, and that Sovereignty will sanctify them all." ³⁹







Advancement of the Gospel.

"Now I want you to know, brethren, that my [imprisonment] has turned out for the greater progress of the Gospel ..."

Philippians 1:12

Religious affections are often quenched by feelings of <u>self-satisfaction</u>.

- <u>Deuteronomy 31:20</u> "For when I bring them into the land flowing with milk and honey, which I swore to their fathers, and they have eaten and are satisfied and become prosperous, then they will turn to other gods and serve them, and spurn Me and break My covenant."
- <u>Jeremiah 22:21</u> "I spoke to you in your prosperity; but you said, 'I will not listen!' This has been your practice from your youth, that you have not obeyed My voice."
- <u>Hosea 13:6</u> "As they had their pasture, they became satisfied, and being satisfied, their heart became proud; therefore they forgot Me."

2 Historically, the greatest progress of the Gospel has often come during the times of the greatest <u>persecution</u>.

- Philippians 1:12-14 "Now I want you to know, brethren, that my circumstances have turned out for the greater progress of the gospel, so that my imprisonment in the cause of Christ has become well known throughout the whole praetorian guard and to everyone else, 14 and that most of the brethren, trusting in the Lord because of my imprisonment, have far more courage to speak the word of God without fear."
- <u>2 Timothy 2:8-9</u> "I suffer hardship even to imprisonment as a criminal [for the Word of God]; but the Word of God is not imprisoned."
- Foxe's Christian Martyrs of the World Two captains of the Roman guard and forty-seven other persons were converted to Christianity, some from Nero's own household! Given the number of Roman senators listed in Foxe's book who were martyred for their faith, one wonders how many were won to Christ either directly or indirectly by Paul during his first Roman imprisonment. 40
- <u>Tertullian</u> (160-220 A.D.) "the blood of the martyrs is the seed of the Church" 41


Corrie Ten-Boom



Corrie Ten-Boom 1892-1983

"In the German camp, with all its horror, I found many prisoners who had never heard of Jesus Christ. ... They were well worth all our suffering"

When the Nazis invaded Holland during World War II, a devout Christian family named the Ten-Booms, provided a hiding place for Jews in their home above their father's watch repair shop. But their Jewish sympathies were discovered and 59 year old Corrie, her sister Betsie, and their father were arrested and sent to Ravensbruck concentration camp. "Yet in the German camp, with all its horror, I found many prisoners who had never heard of Jesus Christ. ... Before long we were holding clandestine Bible study groups for an evergrowing group of believers, and Barracks 28 became known as 'the crazy place where they hope.' But because of the terrible infestation of fleas in Barracks 28, German guards never entered or discovered the Bible study, so Corrie and Betsie thanked God for the fleas! Later through an administrative error Corrie was released. She is the author of The Hiding Place, a personal account of her arrest and time spent in prison. 42


1 To break down <u>Self-reliance</u>, God may deliberately lead us into overwhelming situations.

- Exodus 13:21-14:31 God guided Israel with the pillar of cloud by day and the pillar of fire by night to that place where Israel's back was against the Red Sea and there was no way of escape from Pharoah's armies.
- <u>John Piper</u> "Nothing exalts [God] more than the collapse of self-reliance which issues in passionate prayer for help. "Call upon me in the day of trouble; I will deliver you, and you shall glorify Me" (Psa. 50:15). 43
- <u>John Calvin</u> "Men have no taste for God's power until they are convinced of their need of it and they immediately forget its value unless they are conditionally reminded by awareness of their own weakness." ⁴⁴
- John 15:5 Jesus said, "Apart from Me you can do nothing"

2 To increase our <u>faith</u> in Him, God may deliver us from those same seemingly impossible situations that He has orchestrated.

- Exodus 14:1-30 Israel's deliverance at the Red Sea.
- <u>2 Kings 6:8-23</u> Elisha's deliverance from the armies of Aram.
- <u>2 Chronicles 20:1-25</u> Jehoshaphat/Judah's deliverance from three armies.
- John 11:1-45 Lazarus' deliverance from death.
- Acts 12:1-17 Peter's deliverance from prison.
- Ephesians 3:20 "[God] is able to do exceedingly abundantly beyond all that we ask or think, according to the power that works within us"
- Matthew 19:26 "With God all things are possible"


The Man Born Blind



Jesus healed the man born blind.

"It was neither that this man sinned, nor his parents; but it was in order that the works of God might be displayed in him."

"As Jesus and His disciples passed by a blind man, the disciples asked, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he should be born blind?" (Jn. 9:2). Like Job's three "comforters," the disciples assumed that all suffering was a result of one's own personal sin. But Jesus answered, "It was neither that this man sinned. nor his parents; but it was in order that the works of God might be displayed in him" (John 9:1-3). Perhaps Jesus' reply raises more questions than answers. What or who made this man blind? The answer does not fit today's pop-theology, but the answer is God. The Lord declared to Moses, "Who has made man's mouth? Or who makes him dumb or deaf, or seeing or blind? Is it not I, the Lord?" (Ex. 4:11). God's sovereign plan was that this man should be born blind "that the works of God might be displayed in him" when Jesus later healed Him (John 9:3).






Comfort & Compassion for Others

"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and God of all comfort; who comforts us in all our affliction so that we may be able to comfort those who are in any affliction with the comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God."

2 Corinthians 1:3-5

- 1 The root of "compassion" is passion, and without trials our comfort to others might be sincere, but it will be theoretical and somewhat <u>dispassionate</u>
 - Charles Spurgeon "Many of the trials which are experienced by Christians are sent as an education in the art of sympathy. There is nothing that makes a man have a big heart like a great trial." 45
 - Francis Schaeffer "Biblical orthodoxy without compassion is surely the ugliest thing in the world." 46
- 3 Affliction <u>equips</u> believers to show compassion to others who are afflicted.
 - A.B. Simpson "I never had a trial but when I got out of the deep river I found some poor pilgrim on the bank that I was able to help by that very experience." 47
 - Charles Spurgeon "You must go through the fire if you would have sympathy with others who tread the glowing coals." 48
- 2 The ultimate example of compassion born out of affliction is <u>Christ</u>
 - Hebrews 2:18 "For since He Himself was tempted in that which He has suffered, He is able to come to the aid of those who are tempted."
 - Hebrews 4:15 "For we do not have a high priest who cannot sympathize with our weaknesses, but One who has been tempted in all things as we are, yet without sin"


The Apostle Paul



The Apostle Paul 4-67 A.D.

"[God] comforts us in all our affliction so that we may be able to comfort those who are in any affliction"

Paul's résumé of suffering was extensive: "Five times I received from the Jews thirty-nine lashes. Three times I was beaten with rods. once I was stoned, three times I was shipwrecked, a night and a day I have spent in the deep. I have been on frequent journeys, in dangers from rivers, dangers from robbers, dangers from my countrymen, dangers from the Gentiles, dangers in the city, dangers in the wilderness, dangers on the sea, dangers among false brethren; I have been in labor and hardship, through many sleepless nights, in hunger and thirst, often without food, in cold and exposure. Apart from such external things, there is the daily pressure upon me of concern for all the churches" (2 Cor. 11:24-28: cf. 1 Cor. 4:11-13). Nevertheless, under the influence of the Spirit, suffering enlarged Paul's heart and increased his capacity to comfort others who were likewise tried.





 - Philippians 4:19 "And my God shall supply all your needs according to His riches in glory in Christ Jesus."
 - Charles Spurgeon "Live, then, daily, a life of dependence on the grace of God. Do not set yourself up as if you want to be an independent gentleman; do not start in your own concerns as if you could do all things yourself; but live always trusting in God. You have as much need to trust Him now as ever you have." ⁴⁹


George Müller



George Müller 1805-1898

"they gave thanks for breakfast ... even though there was nothing to eat in the house. As they finished praying, the baker knocked on the door with sufficient fresh bread to feed everyone."

George Müller was born and raised in Prussia, and lived in sin and crime even while studying for the ministry at the state church. He was converted at a prayer meeting in a private home, and from that time his life was changed dramatically. Müller moved to Bristol, England, and by 1870 he had built five large orphans' homes and was feeding 2,100 orphans daily. He solicited no financial help and told only the Lord of the daily needs. Many times he received unsolicited food donations only hours before they were needed to feed the children. On one well-documented occasion, they gave thanks for breakfast when all the children were sitting at the table, even though there was nothing to eat in the house. As they finished praying, the baker knocked on the door with sufficient fresh bread to feed everyone. As a result many children were won to Christ each year. 50




The Patriarch Job ~ 2000 B.C.

James 5:11

"There was a man in the land of Uz whose name was Job, and that man was blameless, upright, fearing God, and turning away from evil..." (Job 1:1). And Job had seven sons and three daughters and his possessions also were 7000 sheep, 3000 camels, 500 yoke of oxen, 500 female donkeys, and very many servants, and "that man was the greatest of all the men of the east" (Job 1:2-3). But within a very short period of time, Job was divested of his possessions (Job 1:15-17), bereaved of his children (Job 1:18-19), and deprived of his health (Job 2:7-8); yet he praised God: "Then Job arose and tore his robe and shaved his head, and he fell to the ground and worshiped. And he said, 'Naked I came from my mother's womb, and naked I shall return there. The Lord giveth and the Lord taketh away. Blessed be the name of the Lord" (Job 1:20-21). Today, Job's name is synonymous with endurance (James 5:11).






Fervent Prayer.

- 1 In Scripture, prayer is compared to the <u>incense</u> that burned on the golden altar and ascended before the throne of God.

And the smoke of the incense, with the prayers of the saints, went up before God out of the angel's hand."
- 2 Just as fire ignited the incense, so also the <u>fires of affliction</u> often fuel the fervency of our prayers.


Horatius Bonar



Horatius Bonar 1808-1889

"What a friend we have in Jesus, all our sins and griefs to bear! What a privilege to carry, everything to God in prayer!"

Horatius Bonar was a Minister of the Church of Scotland, a prolific hymn writer (~600 with ~100 still common use), and a great man of prayer. While Bonar was producing his remarkable output of hymns, he suffered the death of five of his young children in succession. Towards the end of his life, one of his surviving daughters was left a widow with five small children and she returned to live with her parents. The gracious spirit of Horatius and his wife could be clearly seen in a letter to a friend in which he wrote, "God took five children from life some years ago, and He has given me another five to bring up for Him in my old age." Bonar himself was sorely afflicted during the last two years of his life. He died on July 31, 1889, deeply mourned by Christians throughout the world who had come to know him through his wonderful hymns. ⁵⁶

- When we allow God's power for Christian ministry to operate despite our personal weaknesses or affliction, we become trophies of God's grace which He puts on display to touch and inspire others.
 - 2 Corinthians 12:7-9 "Because of the surpassing greatness of the revelations, for this reason, to keep me from exalting myself, there was given me a thorn in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to torment me to keep me from exalting myself! Concerning this I implored the Lord three times that it might leave me. And He has said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for power is perfected in weakness.' Most gladly, therefore, I will rather boast about my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me. Therefore I am well content with weaknesses, with insults, with distresses, with persecutions, with difficulties, for Christ's sake; for when I am weak, then I am strong."
- 2 There are none too <u>weak</u> for God's grace to be displayed, but some too <u>strong</u>.
 - <u>John MacArthur</u> "The same suffering that reveals our weaknesses reveals God's strength, 'for power is perfected in weakness' (2 Cor. 12:9). When we are least effective in our human strength and have only God's power to sustain us, then we are suitable channels through which His power flows. And so we should praise God for adversity because that's when His power is most evident in our lives. There is no one too weak to be powerful, but there are many too strong." ⁵⁷
 - 1 Corinthians 1:26-31 "For consider your calling, brethren, that there were not many wise according to the flesh, not many mighty, not many noble; but God has chosen the foolish things of the world to shame the wise, and God has chosen the weak things of the world to shame the things which are strong, and the base things of the world and the despised God has chosen, the things that are not, so that He may nullify the things that are, so that no man may boast before God. ... so that, just as it is written, 'Let him who boasts, boast in the Lord.'"

Moses




Moses 1526-1406

"Who has made man's mouth? Or who makes him mute or deaf, or seeing or blind? Is it not I, the Lord?"

The Bible declares that "Moses was very meek, more than any man who was on the face of the earth" (Num. 12:3). God chose Moses to deliver Israel from bondage in Egypt, not because he was a dynamic leader or a great speaker, but because he was not. "Moses said to the Lord. 'Please, Lord, I have never been eloquent, neither recently nor in time past, nor since You have spoken to Your servant; for I am slow of speech and slow of tongue.' The Lord said to him, 'Who has made man's mouth? Or who makes him mute or deaf. or seeing or blind? Is it not I, the Lord?" (Exodus 4:10-11). In other words, God made Moses, with all of his meekness and weakness, so that when he delivered Israel, God's grace would be put on display; and as a result Israel would boast in God. not in Moses

• <u>Author Unknown</u> - "Humility is a strange thing. As a rule, once you discover you have it you lose it. 


The Apostle Paul



The Apostle Paul 4-67 A.D.

"to keep me from exalting myself, there was given me a thorn in the flesh"

Paul was arguably the greatest theologian and evangelist in the first century. He wrote at least 13 books of the new Testament and planted dozens of churches. But Paul did not think highly of himself. He called himself "the chief of sinners" (1 Tim. 1:15), "the very least of the saints" (Eph. 3:8), and "the least of the apostles" (1 Cor. 15:9). He acknowledged what others said about him, that "his personal presence [was] unimpressive and his speech contemptible" (2 Cor. 10:10). Christ had personally appeared to Paul and given him many amazing revelations (Gal. 1:11; 2 Cor. 12:1-7), but to keep His servant humble the Lord also gave Paul "a thorn in the flesh" (2 Cor. 12:7), and would not remove it even though the apostle prayed repeatedly for the Lord to take it away (2 Cor. 12:8-9).



- Jerry Bridges "Although we may be going to the Scriptures to learn how to respond to our adversities, we find those adversities in turn help us to understand the Scriptures. It is not that we will learn from adversity something different than what we can learn from the Scriptures. Rather, adversity enhances the teaching of God's Word and makes it more profitable to us. In some instances it clarifies our understanding or causes us to see truths we had passed over before. At other times it will transform "head knowledge" into "heart knowledge" as theological theory becomes a reality to us." 64


John Bunyan



John Bunyan 1628-1688

"Those Scriptures that I saw nothing in before, are made in [prison] to shine upon me. Jesus Christ also was never more real and apparent than now; here I have seen and felt Him indeed."

John Bunyan was arrested at age 32 for preaching the Gospel to the poor. The judge ordered Bunyan to stop preaching, to which he replied, "If I were out of the prison today, I would preach the Gospel again tomorrow, by the help of God." For his "crime" Bunyan spent twelve years in prison in Bedford, England. By day John tagged shoe laces to help support his wife and four children, assisted by his blind daughter at his side. By night, the child was dismissed to her home, and John would meditate upon the Scriptures. He wrote, "I never find, in all my life, so great an inlet into the Word of God as now. Those Scriptures that I saw nothing in before, are made in this place and state to shine upon me. Jesus Christ also was never more real and apparent than now; here I have seen and felt Him indeed." Moreover, from his cell, or "den" as Bunyan called it, came many masterpieces of Christian literature, including Pilgrim's Progress, Bunyan's most famous writing. 65



"Sundar Singh a converted Hindu of India, was put in prison in Nepal for preaching Christ; so he preached to the other prisoners, as did Paul on a similar occasion. The governor then had him thrust into solitary confinement, in a foul-smelling cowhouse tied by hands and feet, with clothing taken away, and leeches thrown on his body. He lifted up his heart to God, and sang His praises, "Though I am a very poor singer," he adds. His accuser said to the jailer, "What do you think of this man? He is so happy though he is suffering." "He must be mad," the jailer replied. The jailer went to the governor. "Our purpose is not being fulfilled," he said. "We hoped with this punishment to make this man sorry and leave off preaching, but we are only adding to his happiness." Then the governor said, "He is only a madman: let him go." 66




The Apostle Peter



Simon Peter 10 B.C. - 64 A.D.

"Beloved, do not be surprised at the fiery ordeal among you, which comes upon you for your testing"

Simon Barjona was a fisherman by trade (Mt. 4:18), and he was probably the oldest disciple when Jesus called him and renamed him Peter (Petros). which means "little rock" (Jn. 1:42). On the night of Jesus' arrest, Jesus said to His disciples, "You will all fall away because of Me this night (Mt. 26:31). But Peter quickly replied, 'Even though all may fall away because of You, I will never fall away" (Mt. 26:33). Jesus answered, "Truly I say to you that this very night, before a rooster crows, you will deny Me three times" (Mt. 26:34). Again Peter protested, "Even if I have to die with You, I will not deny You" (Mt. 26:34). Peter was sincere, but he was sincerely wrong, and Jesus correctly predicted his betrayal (Mt. 26:69-75). The Lord used this trial to break down Peter's self-confidence and expose his fear. Peter thought he was a rock, but the trial showed him his weakness, so that he could grow from it and later strengthen others (Lk. 22:31-32).






The Prophet Elijah ~860 B.C.

Elijah, whose name means "my God is Yah (Yahweh)," was a one of the most colorful characters in the Old Testament and mighty prophet of God. Some of the remarkable events in Elijah's life included being fed by ravens in the wilderness (1 Kings 17:1-7), raising the widow of Zarephath's son from the dead (1 Kings 17:17-24), and the amazing showdown between Elizah and the 450 prophets of Baal on Mount Carmel (1 Kings 18:20-40). But Elijah's meager existence in the wilderness and Queen Jezebel's threats to kill him (1 Kings 19:1-2), gave the prophet a longing for heaven. "He himself went a day's journey into the wilderness, and came and sat down under a juniper tree ...and said, 'It is enough; now, O Lord, take my life" (1 Kings 19:4). And, in arguably the most dramatic exit from this life recorded in the Bible, Elijah was taken up into heaven in a chariot of fire (2 Kings 2:11).

- 1 The Christian Church often <u>slumbers</u> during peace time, but rises to <u>action</u> in times of adversity and opposition.

 - Hymn by William P. Merrill, 1911 "Rise up, O men of God! Have done with lesser things. Give heart and mind and soul and strength, to serve the King of kings. Rise up, O men of God! The church for you doth wait. Her strength unequal to her task; Rise up and make her great!" ⁷²
- 2 Affliction is often God's antidote for spiritual ________.
 - <u>Judges</u> Cycles of disobedience, oppression, repentance and deliverance.
 - Revelation 3:1-3 "To the angel of the church in Sardis write ... I know your deeds, that you have a name that you are alive, but you are dead. Wake up, and strengthen the things that remain, which were about to die; for I have not found your deeds completed in the sight of My God. So remember what you have received and heard; and keep it, and repent. Therefore if you do not wake up, I will come like a thief, and you will not know at what hour I will come to you."

Gladys Aylward




Gladys Aylward 1902-1970

"God has chosen the weak things of the world to shame the things which are strong"

1 Corinthians 1:17

Gladys Aylward did not excel scholastically or set herself apart based on any exhaustive knowledge of the Bible. She became an assistant to an aging missionary in the mountainous Chinese province of Shansi, but after the elder missionary's death, Gladys' work turned in a different direction. During that time China was under attack by Japan and many children were orphaned. These desperate circumstances motivated Gladys to act and soon 100 children were under her care. Fleeing from the Japanese, Gladys lead her children, on foot, 100 miles over the mountains. During the 27 day trek, Gladys became very ill and when they finally reached safety, Gladys was diagnosed with typhus, pneumonia, malnutrition, and extreme exhaustion. Someone has said that when the going gets tough, the tough get going; but Gladys Aylward is a perfect example that when the going gets tough, the Lord can use even the weakest vessel, whose heart is completely His, to perform mighty works.73


Watchman Nee



Watchman Nee 1903-1972

"Instead of resting and getting rusty, why not labor and trust?"

For centuries, the Chinese church has lived under some of the harshest persecution in the world. Into this climate. Watchman Nee was born on November 4, 1903 of Chinese Christian parents. Beginning in the 1930s, Nee helped establish local house churches in China, though he was afflicted with tuberculosis, stomach illness, and angina. He wrote, "In the past days my natural strength has been much weakened. Even light activity causes my body to feel its burden. But praise the Lord that this year was still filled with many days of work. Instead of resting and getting rusty, why not labor and trust?" In 1949, Mao Tse Tung took control of China and in 1952 Watchman Nee was arrested by the Communists. Twenty years later, in 1972, he died in prison. He left a note under his pillow which read: "Christ is the Son of God who died for the redemption of sinners and resurrected after three days. This is the greatest truth in the universe. I die because of my belief in Christ. Watchman Nee." 79

The Time of the Judges



The book of Judges is the history of the nation of Israel from about 1385 to 1055 BC, before Israel had a king. It is the 330 year record of Israel's repeated cycles of disobedience, oppression, repentance and deliverance. When Israel disobeyed the Lord, "He gave them into the hands of plunderers who plundered them; and He sold them into the hands of their enemies around them, so that they could no longer stand before their enemies" (Judges 2:14). But each time Israel repented, the Lord raised up a judge to deliver them. "When the Lord raised up judges for them, the Lord was with the judge and delivered them from the hand of their enemies all the days of the judge; for the Lord was moved to pity by their groaning because of those who oppressed and afflicted them" (Judges 2:19). And so, the Lord used affliction to teach His people the importance of obedience to His Word.





Horatio Spafford, 1873

Horatio Spafford was godly Christian man who experienced two great traumas in his lifetime. First, the great Chicago fire of 1871 destroyed all of Spafford's real estate holdings and left him in near financial ruin. Then, in 1873, Spafford, his wife and four daughters planned a trip to Great Britain to help his close friend Dwight L. Moody with his evangelistic tour. His wife and four daughters went ahead on the French passenger liner S.S. Ville Du Havre, but in route the ship was struck by another vessel and sank in twelve minutes. 226 people drowned including all four of Spafford's daughters. Nine days later Mrs. Spafford cabled her husband this two-word message, "Saved alone." When Spafford made the ocean crossing to meet his grieving wife, the Captain called Spafford to the bridge of the ship and said, "According to my calculations, we are now passing over the place where your children drowned." Spafford thanked the Captain, went back to his cabin, and in the midst of his sorrow Spafford composed the lines to the now famous hymn It is Well With My Soul. 82





On the surface, the first half of Joseph's life looks like a senseless series of tragic events: He was sold to Midianite traders by his own brothers (Gen. 37:26-28), unjustly accused by Potiphar's wife and sent to prison (Gen. 39:7-20), and then forgotten in prison for two years by Pharaoh's cupbearer (Gen. 40:14, 41:1). At the time, Joseph's trials probably didn't make much sense to him. But Joseph's afflictions were God's preparation and positioning for Joseph's future ministry as second in command over all of Egypt under Pharaoh. Joseph said to his brothers, "And as for you, you meant evil against me, but God meant it for good" (Gen. 50:20). God used even the evil actions of the people in Joseph's life to put his faith in the one true God on display in Egypt, to lead his brother's to repentance, and to preserve Israel through seven years of drought.





Righteousness.


Affliction may come as a form of God's <u>discipline</u> which He administers to all of the legitimate children of God.

• Hebrews 12:6-11 - "My son, do not regard lightly the discipline of the Lord, nor faint when you are reproved by Him; for those whom the Lord loves He discipline, and He scourges every son whom He receives. It is for discipline that you endure; God deals with you as with sons; for what son is there whom his father does not discipline? But if you are without discipline, of which all have become partakers, then you are illegitimate children and not sons. Furthermore, we had earthly fathers to discipline us, and we respected them; shall we not much rather be subject to the Father of spirits, and live? For they disciplined us for a short time as seemed best to them, but He disciplines us for our good, so that we may share His holiness. All discipline for the moment seems not to be joyful, but sorrowful; yet to those who have been trained by it, afterwards it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness."

Dealth & wealth teaching is contrary to both Scripture and experience which teach that God can even use poverty and illness to produce righteousness.

- <u>J. I. Packer</u> "Any idea of getting beyond conflict, outward or inward, in our pursuit of holiness in this world is an escapist dream that can only have disillusioning and demoralizing effects on us as waking experience daily disproves it. 


John Newton 1725-1807

John Newton was once the captain of his own slave ship, and it was reported that "at times he was so wretched that even his crew regarded him as little more than an animal. Once he fell overboard and his ship's crew refused to drop a boat to him. Instead they threw a harpoon at him, with which they dragged him back into the ship." But through "many trials, toils and snares" Newton gradually saw his own depravity, received Christ, and finally renounced the slave trade that he had once vigorously supported. At the age of 82, Newton said, "My memory is nearly gone, but I remember two things, that I am a great sinner, and that Christ is a great Saviour." Eight years later he died and on his tombstone was inscribed, "John Newton, Clerk, once an infidel and libertine, a servant of slaves in Africa. was, by the rich mercy of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, preserved, restored, pardoned, and appointed to preach the faith he had long labored to destroy." 86


Martin Luther



Martin Luther 1483-1546

My conscience is captive to the Word of God"

During his study of the book of Romans, Martin Luther realized that salvation is by grace through faith, not through good works. Futhermore, Luther realized that the sale of indulgences, essentially allowing people to buy their salvation, was contrary to the Gospel. On October 31, 1517. Luther nailed his 95 Theses to the door of the Wittenberg Chapel against papal abuses and the sale of indulgences by church officials. Called by the Roman Emperor to appear before the Diet (Counsel) in Wörms. Germany, Luther was ordered to recant of his teachings, to which he replied, "Unless I am convinced by Scripture and plain reason - I do not accept the authority of the popes and councils, for they have contradicted each other - my conscience is captive to the Word of God. God help me. Amen." Luther was declared a heretic and his writings were forbidden. 87

- Richard Wurmbrand "It was strictly forbidden to preach to other prisoners, as it is in captive nations today. It was understood that whoever was caught doing this received a severe beating. A number of us decided to pay the price for the privilege of preaching, so we accepted their terms. It was a deal: we preached and they beat us. We were happy preaching; they were happy beating us—so everyone was happy." 90


Richard Wurmbrand

"If the heart is cleansed by the love of Jesus Christ, and if the heart loves Him, one can resist all tortures."

Romanian pastor Richard Wurmbrand spent 14 years in prison for preaching the gospel. Although his captors smashed four of his vertebrae and either cut or burned 18 holes in his body, they could not defeat him. He testified, "Alone in my cell, cold, hungry, and in rags, I danced for joy every night." During this time he turned to a fellow prisoner, a man he had led to the Lord before they were arrested, and asked, "Have you any resentment against me that I brought you to Christ?" His response: "I have no words to express my thankfulness that you brought me to the wonderful Savior. I would never have it another way." These two men exemplify the heart-felt thankfulness that can be experienced by believers as the result of being severely persecuted. 91


Jim Elliot

"He is no fool who gives up what he cannot keep, to gain what he cannot lose."

In 1955 Jim Elliot was one of five missionaries who attempted to make contact with a fierce tribe of Indians called the Aucas (which translated means "savages"), deep within the dense rain forests of Ecuador. On Tuesday, January 3rd, 1956 the five men landed in a small Piper Cub plane and made camp, but on that Sunday afternoon, January 8th, all five missionaries were speared to death. Undaunted, Jim's wife, Elisabeth Elliot, along with the sister of another one of the martyred missionaries were later able to share the message of Jesus Christ, in the Auca language, to the very men who had speared the five men to death. Comparing earthly treasures to heavenly rewards, Jim Elliot once wrote, "He is no fool who gives up what he cannot keep, to gain what he cannot lose." 93

When they had threatened them further, they let them go..."
- Acts 5:27-42 "When they had brought [the apostles], they stood them before the Council. The high priest questioned them, saying, 'We gave you strict orders not to continue teaching in this name" ... But Peter and the apostles answered, 'We must obey God rather than men." ... [then] they flogged them and ordered them not to speak in the name of Jesus, and then released them. So they went on their way from the presence of the Council, rejoicing that they had been considered worthy to suffer shame for His name. And every day, in the temple and from house to house, they kept right on teaching and preaching Jesus as the Christ."


Hugh Latimer & Nicholas Ridley

Two years after Mary I, Queen of England (1553-1558) settled on the throne, she reestablished Roman Catholicism and bitterly persecuted the Protestants, earning her the nickname "Bloody Mary." During her reign of terror, two of her most notable victims were protestant reformers Nicholas Ridley, bishop of London, and Hugh Latimer, bishop of Worcester. Condemned at St. Mary's church in Oxford, Latimer and Ridley were sentenced to be burned at the stake. On October 2, 1555 the two friends were lead out to the north side of the tower of Oxford, Dr. Marshal, vice-chancellor of Oxford University urged them to recant. Ridley replied, "So long as the breath is in my body I will never deny the Lord and his known truth; God's will be done to me." When the fire was lit, 80 year old Latimer said to the much younger Ridley, "Be of good courage, brother Ridley, and play the man, for we shall this day light such a candle by God's grace in England, as I trust shall never be put out." 94

1 God may sometimes leads His people into and then out of seemingly insurmountable circumstances to turn our whine into worship.

• <u>Israel</u> - They *whined* when they were trapped against the Red Sea as Pharaoh's armies were bearing down upon them (Ex. 14:1-14); then they *worshipped* after they crossed on dry land and Pharaoh's armies were drowned in the sea (Ex. 15:1-21).

- 2 God uses affliction to test and even enhance the <u>sincerity</u> of our worship.
 - <u>Job</u> Divested of his possessions (Job 1:15-17), bereaved of his children (Job 1:18-19), and deprived of health (Job 2:7-8), yet Job praised God (Job 1:20-21; 13:15).
 - <u>Jeremiah</u> In the middle of one of the saddest books of the Bible, Jeremiah rejoiced in God's lovingkindness and compassion (Lam. 3:19-23)
 - <u>Paul and Silas</u> Imprisoned and in chains for their faith in Philippi, at midnight Paul and Silas began "praying and singing hymns of praise to God" (Acts 16:25)
- The end result is that God desires that His people should be <u>overwhelmed</u> by God and not by our circumstances.
 - Psalm 61:1 "When my heart is overwhelmed, lead me to the Rock that is higher than I"

Israel at the Red Sea




Red Sea Crossing 1450 B.C.

After ten miraculous plagues upon Egypt (Exodus, chap. 7-12), Pharaoh finally relented and released Israel from bondage (Ex. 12:30-32). Then God lead Israel in a pillar of cloud by day and a pillar of fire by night (Ex. 13:21-22), to a place where there backs were against the Red Sea (Ex. 14:1-2). But Pharaoh hardened his heart and chased after Israel with all of his army, horsemen, and chariots (Ex. 14:6-9). Israel had no weapons and no way of escape! As Pharaoh's armies approached, Israel cried out against the Lord and His servant Moses (Ex. 14:10-12). "Be silent!" Moses shouted, then God parted the Red Sea and Israel crossed on dry land (Ex. 14:21-22). When Pharaoh's armies pursued, the Lord released the waters and they drowned (Ex. 14:23-31). In Exodus 15, Israel worshiped and praised God for such a might victory (Ex. 15:1-21).

The Sword is Made for War

"Historically, in periods of peace and prosperity, doctrine is treated like a vestigial organ in the body of Christ; that is, in many churches it no longer serves any *practical* purpose. But in truth, the Word of God is a sword (Eph. 6:17; Heb. 4:12). A sword is not made for peace time, but war. When life is easy, men forget the battle, like David on his rooftop, though his troops were at war (2 Sam. 11:1-2). So too, when life is easy, the sword of the Spirit, which is the Word of God, is seldom drawn. O, we may play with it; we may take it out for fencing contests, as in public debate with those of a different sword. But in peace time the great doctrines of the Bible are treated more like a showpiece, a sword in a trophyroom. It is true, "When life is a picnic, we play with theology." 97


Dietrich Bonhoeffer



Dietrich Bonhoeffer 1906-1945

"I'm learning to practice myself what I have said to other people in sermons and books."

Born in Germany in 1906, Dietrich Bonhoeffer was one of the few pastors in Germany who stood courageously in opposition to Adolph Hitler's Nazi regime. Bonhoeffer's efforts to help Jews escape from Germany led to his arrest and imprisonment in the spring 1943 where he spent much of his time writing. He wrote to his parents shortly after his arrest, "I'm learning to practice myself what I have said to other people in sermons and books." In February, 1945, Bonhoeffer was moved to the Flossenbürg concentration camp where he was hanged on April 9, 1945, at the age of 39, just days before the camp was liberated by allied forces. The SS doctor who witnessed Bonhoeffer's death stated that he was a man "devout. brave and composed ... I have hardly ever seen a man die so entirely submissive to the will of God." 98





Yieldedness in Areas that We are Stubborn.

"Before I was afflicted I went astray, but now I keep Your word."

Psalm 119:67

1 Two ways God breaks down areas where we are stubborn:

A. He Draws us with A ffection to Himself.

- <u>Jeremiah 31:3</u> "The Lord appeared to him from afar, saying, "I have loved you with an everlasting love; Therefore I have drawn you with lovingkindness."
- Romans 2:4 "Or do you think lightly of the riches of His kindness and tolerance and patience, not knowing that the kindness of God leads you to repentance?"

B. He Drives us with Affliction to Himself.

- Psalm 119:67 "Before I was afflicted I went astray, but now I keep Your word."
- <u>Hebrews 12:5-6</u> " My son, do not regard lightly the discipline of the Lord, nor faint when you are reproved by Him; for those whom the Lord loves he disciplines and He scourges every son whom He receives."
- Revelation 3:19 "Those whom I love, I reprove and discipline; therefore be zealous and repent."

2 By His Spirit working in us, the Lord uses these methods to <u>Sovereignly</u> overcome stubborn areas of sin in our lives.

- <u>John Piper</u> "Therefore every instance of turning from sin to righteousness is due to the irresistible work of God, who transforms the mind and heart so that the believer prefers righteousness over sin. I conclude, therefore, that no Christian determines ultimately whether he will overcome a temptation to sin. God determines that." ⁹⁹
- <u>Philippians 1:6</u> "For I am confident of this very thing, that He who began a good work in you will perfect it until the day of Christ Jesus."



God commanded Jonah to go to Nineveh, the capital of the Assyrian Empire, to call the Assyrians to repentance (1:2). The Assyrians were legendary for their cruelty and violence. Assyrian rulers boasted of their brutal treatment of the peoples they conquered. Ancient depictions show their enemies beheaded, children disembowelled, and pregnant women ripped open. Even the thought that he should preach to the Assyrians repulsed Jonah, and the possibility that they might repent and God would show mercy on them was even unacceptable (Jonah 3:10-4:4). And so, Jonah boarded a ship in the port city of Joppa and headed the opposite direction toward Tarshish (1:3). But God appointed a great fish (1:17, 2:10) to bring His reluctant prophet back to preach in Ninevah (3:2-3), and the city did indeed repent (3:5-9). 100

So because you are lukewarm, and neither hot nor cold, I will spit you out of My mouth. ... Those whom I love, I reprove and discipline; therefore be zealous and repent."
- <u>Charles Spurgeon</u> "Take care of giving up your first zeal; beware of cooling in the least degree. Ye were hot and earnest once; be hot and earnest still, and let the fire which once burnt within you still animate you. Be ye still men of might and vigour, men who serve their God with diligence and zeal." 101

2 True Christian zeal springs from the heart that has an all-consuming desire for the glory of the Lord.

- Ezra 7:23 "Whatever is commanded by the God of heaven, let it be done with zeal for the house of the God of heaven"
- Charles Spurgeon "If you never have sleepless hours, if you never have weeping eyes, if your heart never swells as if it would burst ... You do not know the beginning of true zeal, for the foundation of Christian zeal lies in the heart. The heart must be heavy with grief and yet must beat high with holy ardor. The heart must be vehement in desire, panting continually for God's glory, or else we shall never attain to anything like the zeal which God would have us know." 102
- 3 Zeal is distinguished from ordinary religious affections, by the trials and affliction it overcomes to <u>serve the Lord</u>.


Susannah Spurgeon



Susannah Spurgeon 1832-1903

"The moment we come into any trial or difficulty, our first thought should be ... how can we best glorify God in it."

In 1855, Susannah Thompson married a young man by the name of Charles Haddon Spurgeon, who was destined to become one of the most famous preachers of all time. By the time she was 33, however, Susannah was bed-ridden with a chronic illness. But her weakened condition only aroused her zeal. During this time she wrote, "The moment we come into any trial or difficulty, our first thought should be, not how soon can we escape from it, or how we may lessen the pain we shall suffer from it, but how can we best glorify God in it." From her bedside. Susannah started a book fund. in order to place Christian materials into the hands of ministers too poor to afford them. Initially Susannah used money that she had saved for her own personal use for this effort. Impressed by the example of his frail wife, Charles Spurgeon wrote, "For most human maladies, the best relief and antidote will be found in the selfsacrificing work for the Lord Jesus." 103

Anxiety & Worry.

1 Some causes identified in Scripture.

- a. Unconfessed sin
- Psalm 38:18 "I am full of anxiety because of my sin."

b. Worry about basic provisions

• Matthew 6:25-30 - "Do not be *anxious* for your life, as to what you shall eat, or what you shall drink; nor for your body, as to what you shall put on.... And which of you by being anxious can add a single cubit to his life's span? And why are you anxious about clothing? Observe how the lilies of the field grow; they do not toil nor do they spin, yet I say to you that even Solomon in all his glory did not clothe himself like one of these. But if God so arrays the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the furnace, will He not much more do so for you, O men of little faith?"

c. Worry about the future

• Matthew 6:34 - "Therefore do not be *anxious* for tomorrow; for tomorrow will care for itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own."

d. The fear of man

• <u>Luke 12:11-12</u> - "And when they bring you before the synagogues and the rulers and the authorities, do not become *anxious* about how or what you should speak in your defense, or what you should say; for the Holy Spirit will teach you in that very hour what you ought to say."

a. Reprioritize Christ first

• Matthew 6:31-33 - "Do not be *anxious* then, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'With what shall we clothe ourselves?' For all these things the Gentiles eagerly seek; for your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. But seek first His kingdom and His righteousness; and all these things shall be added to you."

b. Pray with thanksgiving

 <u>Philippians 4:6-7</u> - "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all comprehension, shall guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

c. Meditate on God's promises

Psalm 94:19 - "When my anxious thoughts multiply within me, Thy
consolations delight my soul."

d. Take control of your thought life

- <u>2 Corinthians 10:5</u> "take every thought captive to the obedience of Christ."
- Philippians 4:8-9 "Finally, brethren, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is of good repute, if there is any excellence and if anything worthy of praise, let your mind dwell on these things. When these fears are not combated with the fear of the Lord, the consequences can be devastating. But when God is given his rightful place in our lives, old bonds can be shattered." 112
- Matt. 10:28 "And do not fear those who kill the body, but are unable
 to kill the soul; but rather fear Him who is able to destroy both soul and
 body in hell."

c. Magnify the Lord

- Psalm 27:1,3 "The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? The Lord is the defense of my life; whom shall I dread? ... Though a host encamp against me, my heart will not fear"



- Note ----

- The Christian should fear God's discipline which may be sorrowful (Heb. 12:5-11), but should never fear God's punishment or wrath (1 John 4:17-18; Rom. 5:9; 1 Thess. 1:10, 5:9).
- The non-Christian, on the other hand, should fear the wrath of God (Rev. 14:9-11; Rom. 1:18-20, 2:5, 9:22; Eph. 2:1-3; 5:5-6; Col. 3:5-6)

Focus of the Fear of God

"For the child of God, the primary meaning of the fear of God is veneration and honor, reverence and awe. It is the attitude that elicits from our hearts adoration and love, reverence and honor. It focuses not upon the wrath of God but upon the majesty, holiness, and transcendent glory of God." ¹¹⁷

C Depression.

1 Some causes identified in Scripture.

a Unconfessed Sin.

- Psalm 32:3-4 "When I kept silent about my sin, my body wasted away through my groaning all day long. For day and night Thy hand was heavy upon me; my vitality was drained away as with the fever heat of summer."
- <u>Biblical Counseling Foundation</u> "Depression is not a disease. While there are some organic malfunctions that may trigger feelings of depression, many symptoms and maladies defined as depression (whether short-lived or chronic) are the consequences of unbiblical habits and/or sinful reactions to circumstances and other people. Depression that stems from unbiblical living can be overcome as you deal biblically with your sins and purposefully live in a manner that is pleasing to the Lord." 119

b. Guilt & feelings of remorse.

• Matthew 26:74-75 - "Then [Peter] began to curse and swear, 'I do not know the man!' And immediately a cock crowed. And Peter remembered the word which Jesus had said, 'Before a cock crows, you will deny Me three times.' And he went out and wept bitterly."

c. Anger

- Genesis 4:5 "but for Cain and for his offering He had no regard. So Cain became very angry and his *countenance fell.*"
- <u>Jonah 4:1, 3</u> "But it greatly displeased Jonah, and he became angry. ... Therefore now, O Lord, please take my life from me, for death is better to me than life."

d. Fear of people

Psalm 6 - "I am pining away ... my bones are dismayed" (v.2), "my soul is greatly dismayed" (v.3), "I am weary with my sighing; every night I make my bed swim, I dissolve my couch with my tears." (v.6), "my eye has wasted away with grief; It has become old because of all my adversaries."

Causes of Depression

"So what is the cause of depression? That is like asking, what is the cause of suffering? There are at least five different causes. First, we can cause our depression. Our own sin, unbelief, commitment to our interpretations instead of searching for God's interpretation can all be causes of depression. Second, other people can cause our depression. A steady diet of discouraging words from people who are supposed to love us, or sexual violation and its shame can certainly contribute to depression. Third, our bodies can cause depression. Our bodies can't create hopelessness or loss of purpose, but they can disrupt sleep, fog our thinking, and cause us to have the physical feelings of depression. Fourth, Satan, arguably, can cause depression. He can afflict the body and heap accusations on the sensitive conscience. Fifth, God is over all things, including suffering and depression. We can say that He allows it, and we can say that there are times when He ordains it." ¹²⁰

a. Confession & repentance

 Acts 3:19 - "Repent therefore and return, that your sins may be wiped away, in order that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord."

b. Forget what lies behind

- Philippians 3:13-14 "forgetting what lies behind and reaching forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus."
- D. Marty Lloyd-Jones "Would you like to be rid of this spiritual depression? The first thing you have to do is to say farewell now once and for ever to your past. Realize that it has been covered and blotted out in Christ. Never look back at your sins again. Say: 'It is finished; it is covered by the Blood of Christ.' That is your first step. Take that and finish with yourself and all this talk about goodness, and look to the Lord Jesus Christ. It is only then that true happiness and joy are possible for you. What you need is not to make resolutions to live a better life, to start fasting and sweating and praying. No! You just begin to say: I rest my faith on Him alone who died for my transgressions to atone." 121

c Obedience

• Genesis 4:7 - "If you do well, will not your countenance be lifted up? And if you do not do well, sin is crouching at the door; and its desire is for you, but you must master it."

Balancing Medicine & Christianity

"Medication for some people functions like aspirin in that it might alleviate symptoms, but not necessarily treat causes. People, of course, are free to take medication. Medication should, however, come with a warning. Medication cannot address spiritual matters. It can help a person sleep, and it might alleviate some pain, but it does not have the power to build faith. Too often, those who take medication adopt the medical perspective that comes with it, that is, that the cause of depression is the physical body. Then they are less inclined to fight the spiritual battle that inevitably emerges with depression, and they are slower to turn to Christ for spiritual strength. Regardless of the cause of depression, the deepest reality is that suffering, on this side of the cross, has redemptive purposes. When sufferers understand that God has a purpose in suffering, they tend to pause before they reach for the psychiatric medication." 122

This is a command and therefore an act of the will, and it is done in the Lord. No circumstance is so dismal as to prevent obedience to the command. No trouble can blast that safeguard. Do it. Do it by faith. Delight yourself in the Lord. Maybe you will have to get out of bed, get up from your chair, go outdoors and walk, sing a song out loud, bake a pie for somebody, or mow the lawn as an offering of praise. You can do something which will help you to obey that command. It is amazing how strongly what we do affects how we feel." 123

e. Trust in the Lord with all your heart.

• Proverbs 3:5-8 - "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge Him, and He will make your paths straight. Do not be wise in your own eyes; fear the Lord and turn away from evil. It will be healing to your body, and refreshment to your bones."

f. Preach the Gospel to yourself

- Psalm 42:5,11 "Why are you in despair, O my soul? And why have you become disturbed within me? Hope in God, for I shall yet praise Him, the help of my countenance, and my God."
- D. Martyn Lloyd-Jones "Have you realized that most of your unhappiness in life is due to the fact that you are listening to yourself instead of talking to yourself? Take those thoughts that come to you the moment you wake up in the morning. You have not originated them, but they start talking to you, they bring back the problem of yesterday, etc. Somebody is talking. Who is talking to you? Your self is talking to you. Now [David's] treatment [in Psalm 42] was this; instead of allowing this self to talk to him, he starts talking to himself, 'Why art thou cast down, O my soul?' he asks. His soul had been repressing him, crushing him. So he stands up and says: 'Self, listen for a moment, I will speak to you'." 124

g. Pray without ceasing

• Philippians 4:6-7 - "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all comprehension, shall guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."


Addictions.

Descriptions & definitions.

- 1 John 2:16-17 "For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh and the lust of the eyes and the boastful pride of life, is not from the Father, but is from the world. And the world is passing away, and also its lusts; but the one who does the will of God abides forever."
- <u>Titus 3:3</u> "For we also once were foolish ourselves, disobedient, deceived, enslaved to various lusts and pleasures, spending our life in malice and envy, hateful, hating one another." -
- <u>James 1:14-15</u> "But each one is tempted when he is *carried away and enticed by his own lust*. Then when lust has conceived, it gives birth to sin; and when sin is accomplished, it brings forth death."
- <u>1 Peter 2:11</u> Beloved, I urge you as aliens and strangers to abstain from *fleshly lusts, which wage war* against the soul."
- Ephesians 2:1-3 "And you were dead in your trespasses and sins, in which you formerly walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, of the spirit that is now working in the sons of disobedience. Among them we too all formerly lived in the lusts of our flesh, *indulging the desires of the flesh and of the mind*, and were by nature children of wrath, even as the rest."
- Edward T. Welch "The Bible has a different view of how we first get involved in addictions. Instead of explaining the overpowering urge for [something] as a disease, the Bible talks about our motivations and desires, forces so powerful that they can take over our lives. The Bible says that we first choose our addictions, and only then do our addictions choose us." 126
- Edward T. Welch "If we allow the Bible to reveal the unseen spiritual realities behind addictions, we suddenly realize that addictions are more than self-destructive behaviors. They are violations of God's laws: His laws that call us to avoid drunkenness and immoderate self-indulgence (Rom. 13:13), His law that calls us to love others (1 John 4:7), and His law that calls us to live for Him rather than ourselves (1 Cor. 10:31). This means that addiction is more about someone's relationship with God than it is about biology. It reveals our allegiances: what we want, what we love, whom and what we serve. It brings us to that all-important question, 'Will you live for the fulfillment of your desires or for God?'" 127

Freedom From Bondage

"When individuals rebel against God, they don't achieve freedom. They fall into bondage, because rebellion is sin, and sin is a tyrant. On the other hand, when men and women submit to God, becoming his slaves, they become truly free. They achieve the ability fully to become the special, unique beings that God created them to be." 128


Overcome Persistent Sin

- - John 8:31-32, 34, 36 "If you continue in My word, then you are truly disciples of Mine; and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you *free*.... Truly, truly, I say to you, everyone who commits sin is the *slave* of sin.... So if the Son makes you *free*, you will be *free* indeed."
 - Romans 6:12-18 "Therefore do not let sin reign in your mortal body so that you obey its lusts, and do not go on presenting the members of your body to sin as instruments of unrighteousness; but present yourselves to God as those alive fro the dead, and your members as instruments of righteousness to God. For sin shall not be master over you, for you are not under law but under grace. What then? Shall we sin because we are not under law but under grace? May it never be! Do you not know that when you present yourselves to someone as *slaves* for obedience, you are *slaves* of the one whom you obey, either of sin resulting in death, or of obedience resulting in righteousness? But thanks be to God that though you were *slaves* of sin, you became obedient from the heart to that form of teaching to which you were committed, and having been *freed* from sin, you became slaves of righteousness."
 - <u>2 Peter 2:19</u> "... for by what a man is overcome, by this he is *enslaved*."



Can a Christian Have an Addiction?

"Can Christians be addicted? I always like a question to which I can give a direct answer, and the answer here is 'Yes'. We live in bodies, and with hearts and minds, that if exposed to sin are often brought into bondage to those sins. Different people have different predispositions to addiction. For some it is alcohol, for others it is pornography or nicotine ... Let me say a word of encouragement, therefore, to all you sin addicts. Maybe it is a substance addiction, like alcoholism, or maybe a certain sin that has taken root in your flesh, in your mind, in your heart. It could be pornography; it could be vicious speech. In all of these cases, you can be delivered by the power of God through Jesus Christ and the working of the Holy Spirit. Christians can go beyond the mere coping offered by groups like Alcoholics Anonymous – groups who offer people real help but not deliverance. You can be delivered because of the power of God available in Jesus Christ. Indeed, all who have come to Jesus are being delivered not just from this sin or that, but to sin itself. Jesus Christ is leading us out of our sinful state even now, sanctifying us progressively so that we are becoming more and more holy. Progressive deliverance from sin is the normal experience of a growing Christian. For those areas where we as individuals are particularly under sin's influence, we need to turn to God in faith and prayer, asking for a new work of power in our lives." 130
