

Psalm 108 Devotions

☐ Monday - Give Thanks For His Lovingkindness. Psalm 108:3-4
“I will give thanks to You, O Lord, among the peoples, and I will sing praises to You among the nations. For Your lovingkindness is great above the heavens, and Your truth reaches to the skies” (Psa. 108:3-4). Listen to David’s resolve, “I will give thanks ... I will sing praise” (v. 17). He is saying, “Nothing has changed around me, but something has changed in me: namely, my focus on God!” Christian, if your worship of God depends on your circumstances, then you will be at best a fair-weather-worshipper. Base your praise and thanksgiving, not on your changing circumstances, but on the unchanging character of God!
Read Psalm 150:2

☐ Tuesday - You’re An Ambassador for Jesus Christ. Psalm 108:3
“I will give thanks to You, O Lord, among the peoples, and I will sing praises to You among the nations” (Psa. 108:3). Christian, the Bible calls you an ambassador for Jesus Christ (2 Cor. 5:20). That is your job. But you say, “I already have a secular job.” Yes, and now you must ask God for wisdom on how to be an ambassador for Jesus Christ there at your work, but not there only. You must learn how to be Christ’s ambassador at the grocery store, at school, at the gas station, wherever you go. And your job as an ambassador for Jesus Christ is to spread His fame; that is, to know Him and make Him known. Yes, “Tell of His glory among the nations, His wonderful deeds among all the peoples” (Psa. 96:3).
Read Psalm 57:9

☐ Wednesday - God Has Spoken in His Holiness. Psalm 108:7
“God has spoken in His holiness” (Psa. 108:7). God is holy, and every word that He speaks is holy, for when He speaks He speaks according to His nature; He cannot speak otherwise. Every word in His written Word is holy: every promise is holy, every warning is holy, every blessing is holy. No other person has ever spoken to you this way, Christian, but God has never spoken to you any other way. Every one of God’s words is trustworthy, righteous and just. “They are more desirable than gold, yes, than much fine gold” (Psa. 19:10).
Read Psalm 19:7-11

☐ Thursday - God’s Beloved. Psalm 108:6
“That Your *beloved* may be delivered, save with Your right hand, and answer me!” (Psa. 108:6). Here God’s people are called “beloved” (Jude 1:1). This is the Lord’s indelible brand upon His sheep which cannot be removed or fade with time, for He loves His people with an everlasting love (Jer. 31:3). It is Christ’s wedding vow to His Bride, the Church, whom He cherishes (Eph. 5:29). Here, in one word, is God’s relation to His people – “Beloved”! It motivates His every thought toward you, moves His hand to act on your behalf, and moves His heart to pour forth with His deepest affection. “I am my beloved’s and my beloved is mine” (Song of Sol. 6:3).
Read Romans 8:39, 9:25

☐ Friday - Through Our God We Shall Do Valiantly. Psalm 108:13
“Through God we will do valiantly, and it is He who will tread down our enemies” (Psa. 108:13). Here God’s sovereignty over the battle (2 Chron. 20:15), and man’s responsibility to fight the good fight (1 Tim. 6:12) are set side-by-side. God’s sovereignty should never be an excuse for human inaction, but rather the greatest reason for “valiant” effort. With every fiber of your being, Christian, you must fight the good fight of faith, yet never forget that victory belongs to the Lord (Prov. 21:31). This is a great mystery, but a profound truth, and the key to victorious Christian living.
Read Ephesians 6:10-18
